What do Patient Participation Groups do?

Patient Participation Groups (PPGs) help to make sure that the views of patients are included when developing services. GP surgeries work with patients to improve services and promote health and wellbeing and ensure patients visiting the surgery have a good all-round experience.

PPG's give patients the opportunity to help direct services both within the surgery and also in the local health care setting, so that the service they provide best meets the needs of everyone. Not only does a PPG involve patients in the planning and delivery of healthcare services, they can raise awareness of local health priorities, and can also help to strengthen the relationship between patient and staff.

PPGs also have another important role in that they feed back the patient view into the Patient & Public Engagement Committee (PPEC).

Mansfield and Ashfield Clinical Commissioning Group or CCG (the part of the NHS which plans and pays for healthcare services) need to understand the views and experiences of the communities in which they work. To do this they established a special patient reference group called the Citizens Reference Panel and PPGs, along with local government, voluntary sector organisations, health groups, young people and Healthwatch all work together to make sure that the views of patient groups are represented.
