

## Social media support volunteer

No formal qualifications needed for this role. There will be an interview, trial period and an application form will be required. Starts 8th of January 2024, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings.



This is an opportunity to use your existing social media skills, to make a big difference in your local community and influence change in the health and social care service. This volunteering opportunity can be home based although you are welcome to use their office in Hucknall with prior arrangement.

## Who/ Where.

Healthwatch Nottinghamshire's mission is to be the public's voice within health and social care. The organisation gathers public opinion and experience of health and social care and ensures the decision makers within health and social care are held to account. They have a location in Hucknall that you attend however you can work from home with communications through Teams.

## Job role.

Your role will be to work with the communications office to enhance Healthwatch Nottingham's social media presents, to engage with the public, share information and gather insight into current issues within health and social care. You will develop content for their website and many social medias, write articles for their news audiences for digital content using platforms such as LinkedIn, Instagram and Nextdoor. A few skills you will need are; IT skills, non-judgmental and respectful attitude, ability to research and source information and experience in creating visually engaging content.

## Good to know.

There will be an application form, informal interview, you will need references and there will be a trial period. Support and inductions will be provided to ensure you feel comfortable and confident with the role. You will work alongside their communications officer who is happy to support and advise as required.
